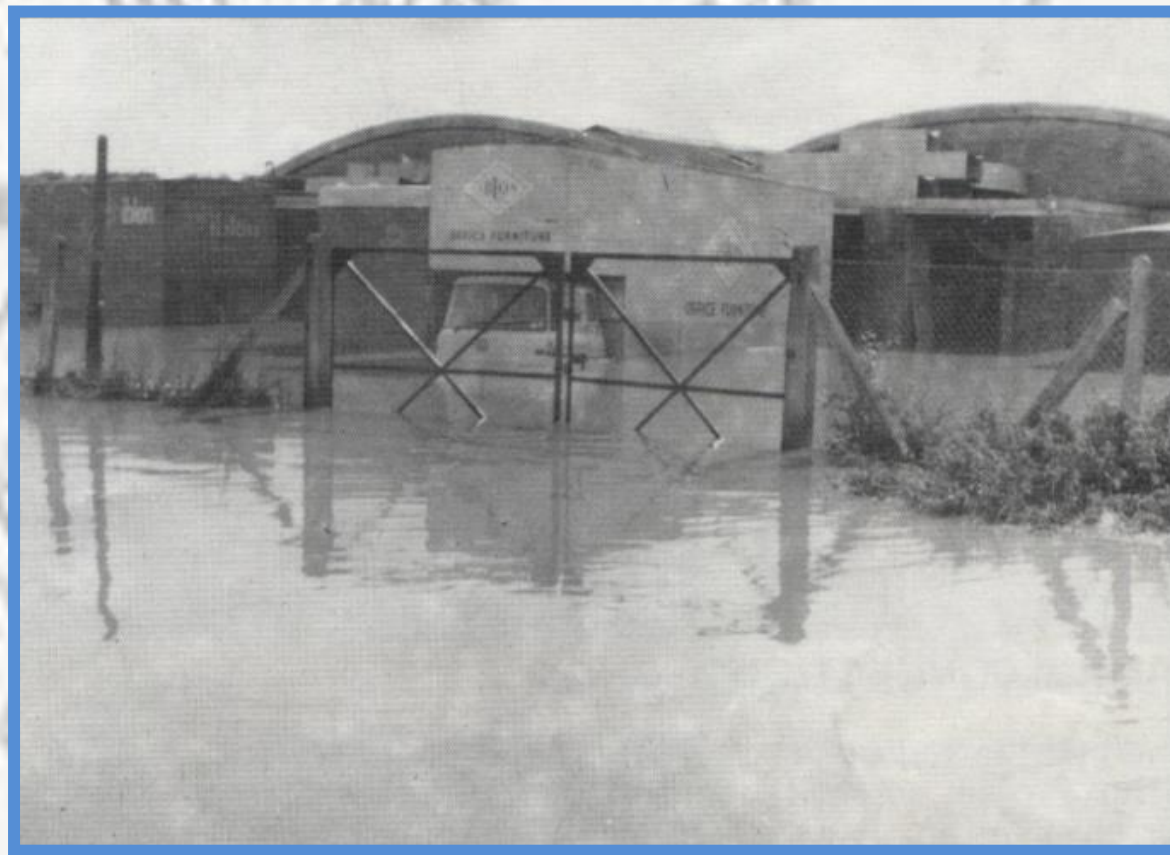

Project Office Furniture was founded in 1928 in the East End of London. Further expansion capacity required during the 1960s prompted the company's relocation to Haverhill. The company was acquired from the Bloomn family by Bullough plc in 1977.

Besides the factory sites in Haverhill there were eight showrooms and studios nation-wide. The Design and Development Centre which was based in Haverhill, utilised some of the best facilities and equipment available in the industry.

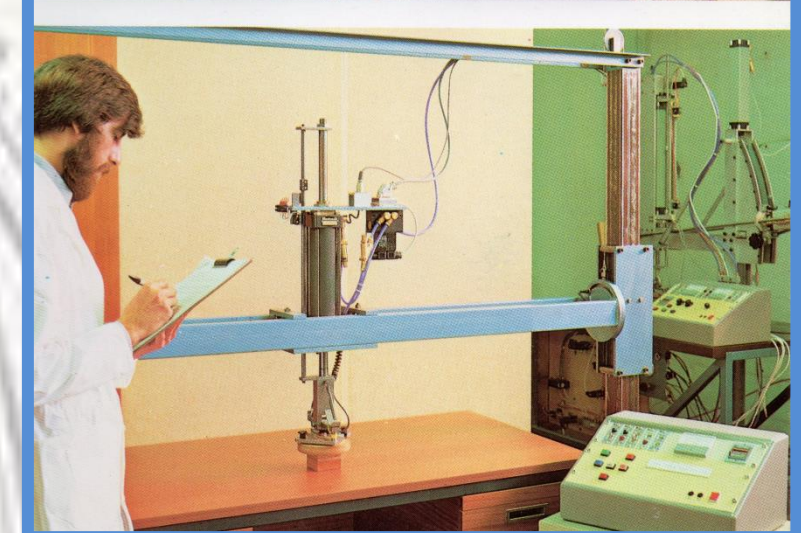

In September 1968 the heavens opened. Flooding throughout the factory and offices varied between 3ft to 4ft 6ins in depth and losses due to materials and machinery damage, together with disruption to work were put at £250,000. It took some four months before pre-flood levels could be resumed.

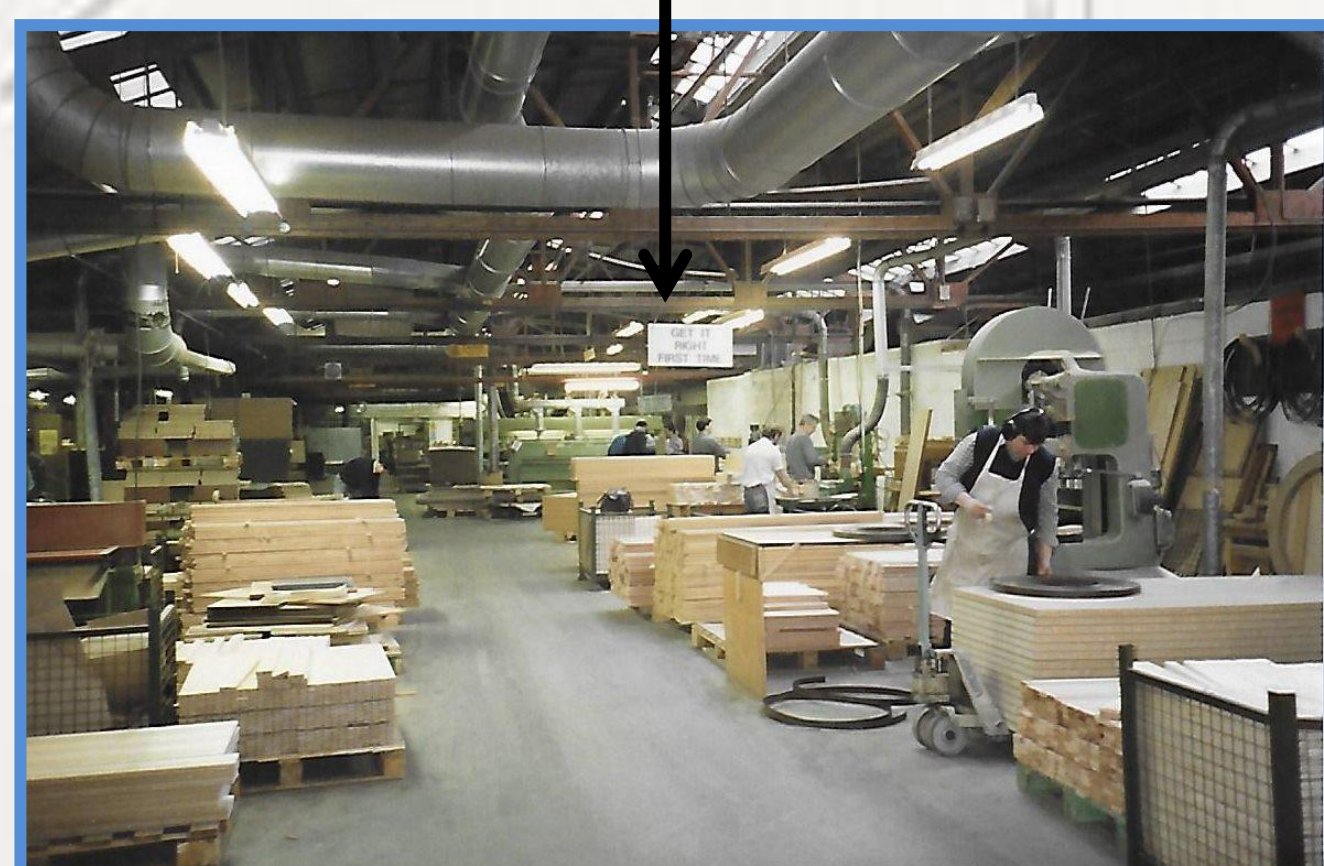

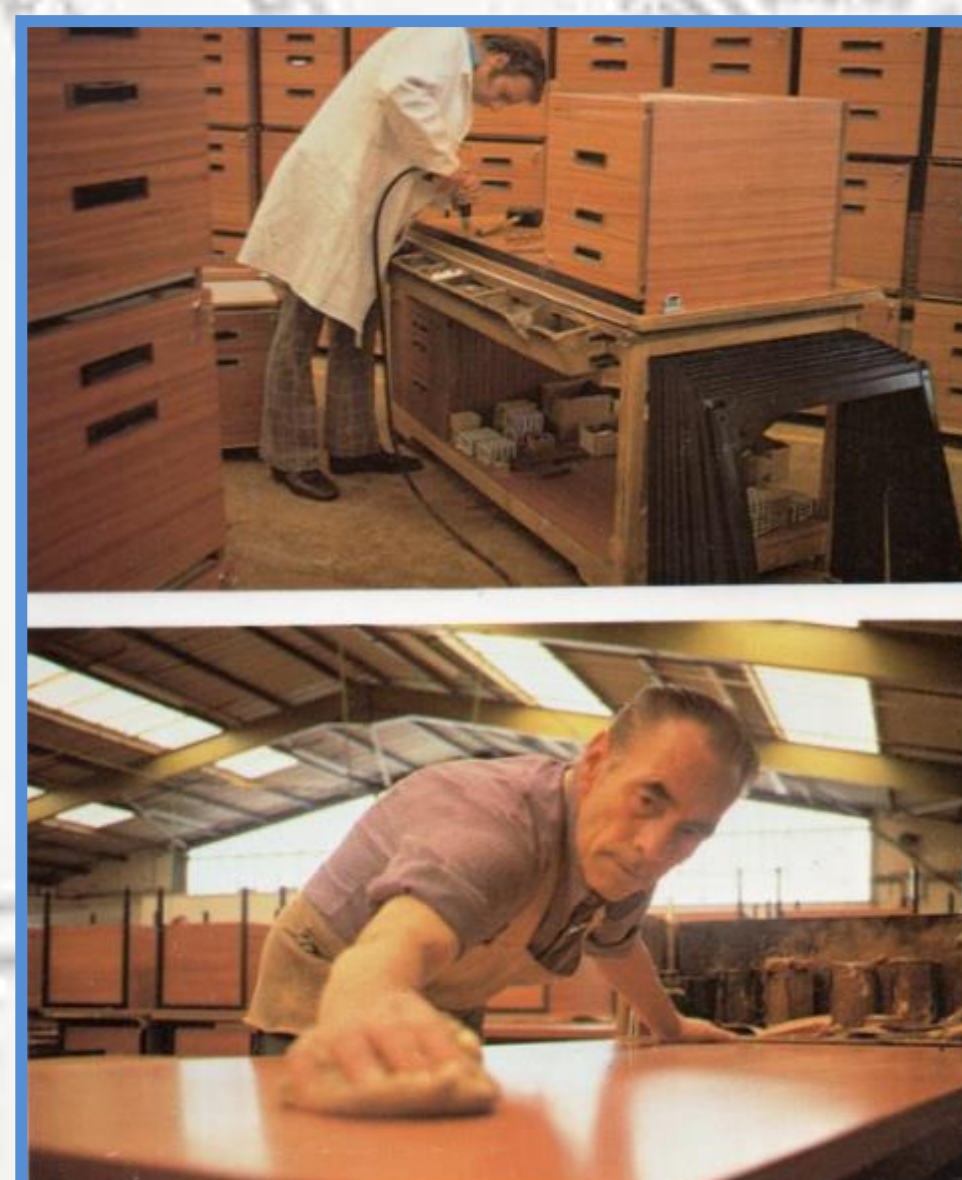
